Chasing and Repoussé: Great Techniques for Form & Texture

with Nancy Megan Corwin

May 1-3, 2020

Megan will bring chasing tools students can use in class. The studio also has chasing tools to share, and you are encouraged bring what you have to the workshop. We will also be making tools as part of the workshop. Your \$5 material fee payable to Megan will cover the steel to make your tools.

The following is a list of required tools & materials students need to bring to class:

(Please note that I have listed the pitch bowl and base as optional – if your studio does not supply the students with these items you may want to move this to required)

- Minimum 12"x12" sheet of 22 gauge copper preferably pre-cut into 3" x 3" pieces (available to pre-order through the studio)
- 6" metal ruler (available to borrow or buy at the studio)
- Ballpoint pen (it will be ruined for writing)
- Cheap pair of long needle nose pliers from the hardware store
- Cheap stainless steel regular soup spoon – not ladle
- Jewelers saw blades – 2/0 (available to purchase)
- Medium cut large file dedicated to steel (an old jeweler's file is the best)
- Closed-toe shoes, hair tie, leather gloves, safety goggles or glasses with sides (Please note: prescription glasses are not safety glasses)
- Cotton apron or all cotton clothes
- Cotton rags for drying metal
- Drawing pencils with eraser and paper
- Lip balm (plain ChapStick or plain Burt's Bees) – three sticks
- Personal chasing bowl with base, pitch, hammer, tools, etc. *If you have purchased an unfilled bowl, please fill it before the first day of class – there are lots of sites on the internet with instructions on filling a pitch bowl – You can email Megan if you have questions: nmegan@mindspring.com* (The studio also has a limited number of pitch bowls that may be borrowed if requested in advance)

****Optional:**

The studio is well equipped with basic hand tools stocked at every bench. If you prefer to bring your own, we may also be using the following:

- Jewelers saw frames, pliers, files, metal shears, scribe, tin snips or cutters
- Dapping tools
- Favorite pattern and number stamps
- Sterling silver in 22 gauge for students who are beyond beginning

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
